

Midfield City Learning Options

Due to the rising number of COVID-19 cases, Midfield City Schools will start the first nine weeks of the academic school year remotely (**Option 3**). As the rate of COVID-19 spread lessens, the district will shift to a "hybrid/blended learning" model (Option 2). Once it is deemed safe, the district will then gradually phase into face-to-face learning in our schools(Option 1).



Traditional Option 1

Low/ No Spread

Schools are fully open and operating under traditional instructional delivery.

- Traditional face-to-face learning where students will return to the classroom with increased social distancing and other safety measures in place.
- Masks will be strongly recommended for students and staff.
- Controlled movement will be in place where possible and mass gatherings, assemblies and field trips will be limited.

Hybrid/Blended Option 2

Minimal Spread

Schools will be fully open, but operate under a hybrid rotation of instructional delivery to include traditional, classroom teaching and remote instruction.

- Students will be split into two groups. Each group will spend two days in a classroom receiving face-to-face instruction and three days of distance learning.
- Only half the school's population will be on site at one time, allowing for strict social distancing both in the classroom and on the bus

Virtual/Remote Option 3

Substantial Spread

Schools will be completely shut down so that all students will be engaged in remote learning.

- Students will not physically attend school but will participate in a school-based distance learning program from home.
- Instructional delivery will include such strategies as live, virtual instruction, interactive videos and independent work.
- The school-based eLearning program will be taught by Midfield City School teachers.
- Students will be expected to log in daily for attendance.

- All students will receive a laptop and wireless hotspot.
- All faculty and staff will receive a laptop and wireless hotspot.



- Teachers will provide instructional videos to help guide learning when students are not able to access the teacher.
- Parents will be provided step by step instructional videos on how to access and utilize Google classroom.



- Midfield City school buses will deliver meals throughout the community.

- ESL teacher will reach out to families to determine how to best support students and their families.
- Special Education Teachers and Related Service Providers will reach out to families to determine how to best support students and their families. They will review initial plans, listen to parent feedback, and determining how to best provide services remotely without overwhelming families.
